**ASSESSMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE TO SMALL/MEDIUM-SIZED MANUFACTURERS.** E3 (Energy/Economy/Environment) assessments are now available from Texas IOF and the Texas Manufacturing Assistance Centers. These three day assessment and training events identify opportunities for cost, energy and pollution reductions through application of lean, clean and energy efficiency methodologies. In addition, sites will receive 40 hours of implementation assistance. To qualify, manufacturers should have an energy bill of at least \$1 million/year.
